

New Industry Standard for Minimum Connect Time (MCT)

Product Advisory-3657

From 27th October 2019, a new industry standard for Minimum Connect Time (MCT) will go into effect. The new IATA MCT standard will introduce new data elements and processing rules to be used when validating if a connection is allowed between two flights.

Minimum Connect Time (MCT) is defined as the shortest time interval required to transfer a passenger and his luggage from one flight to a connecting flight. An MCT can also suppress (block) a connection from being constructed.



Travelport's Minimum Connect Time (MCT) processing and displays will be enhanced to support the new **IATA MCT** standard.



Travelport uses MCT records supplied by airports/carriers:

- when building connecting flights in availability and search/shop responses
- as requested by the user to validate connecting flights that were manually constructed

• upon end transaction to ensure connecting flights are valid prior to ending the PNR

Required :

- 1. Minimum of two (2) flights .
- 2. Validate up to three connections

- 1. Carrier Code
- 2. FLT number
- 3. Origin/Departure Airport Code
- 4. Destination/Arrival Airport Code
- 5. FLT Departure Date
